AGE 10 YEARS & UP

Junior Docent at the American Indian Area (Rock Ledge Ranch Historic Site)

Wear authentic period clothing while demonstrating skills such as: cooking, hide tanning, games, traditional music and dance, beadwork and other artwork. It is desirable that applicants have significant knowledge of American Indian Culture. Must be able to work out of doors, follow verbal and written directions, have good communication skills, and be willing to get dirty.

Colorado Springs Pioneers Museum Junior Docent Program

Enthusiastic students entering grades 6th-12th are invited to apply for the summer Junior Docent program.

Junior Docents become educators for the summer, introducing visitors from around the globe to the unique history of the Pikes Peak region. Junior Docents are trained to interpret exhibits, handle and share information on historic artifacts, lead craft and demonstration activities, and interact with visitors of many ages and backgrounds.

Placement in the 2016 Colorado Springs Pioneers Museum Junior Docent program is selective and is dependent on several factors including strength of interview, age, maturity, interest, and scheduling availability.

Applications: Accepted on a rolling basis starting Friday, April 1; deadline of May 6 by 5 p.m.

AGE 12 YEARS & UP

Facility Assistant I (Meadows Park Community Center)

Assist staff with greeting visitors, filing, answering phones, taking messages, facility room set up and clean up, assist with packing food for emergency food pantry and light duty facility maintenance.

AGE 13 YEARS & UP

Park Aide (North Cheyenne Canon at Helen Hunt Falls Visitor Center)

Have fun assisting staff and interacting with visitors in this beautiful mountain park! Answer visitors' questions about hikes, exhibits, and programs offered at Helen Hunt Falls Visitor Center. Support hummingbird craft project and program. Share park information with visitors from around the world, including interesting topics from gold panning to geology. Enhance young visitors' experience by utilizing hands-on displays.

Days/Times: A minimum of one shift per week between June 3-September 5; 9 a.m.-1 p.m. or 1:15-5:15 p.m. (10 shifts total) Any missed shifts can be made-up throughout the summer.

1907 Orchard House Junior Docent (Rock Ledge Ranch Historic Site)

Wear authentic period clothing while conducting tours of the 2nd and 3rd floors of the Orchard House, assisting staff with daily chores (cooking, dusting, laundry, and sewing) and interpreting the history of the Pikes Peak Region in early 20th century. Must be able to work without close supervision, follow verbal and written directions, have excellent communication skills and be able to speak comfortably and clearly with visitors.

Skate Patrol (Sertich Ice Center)
